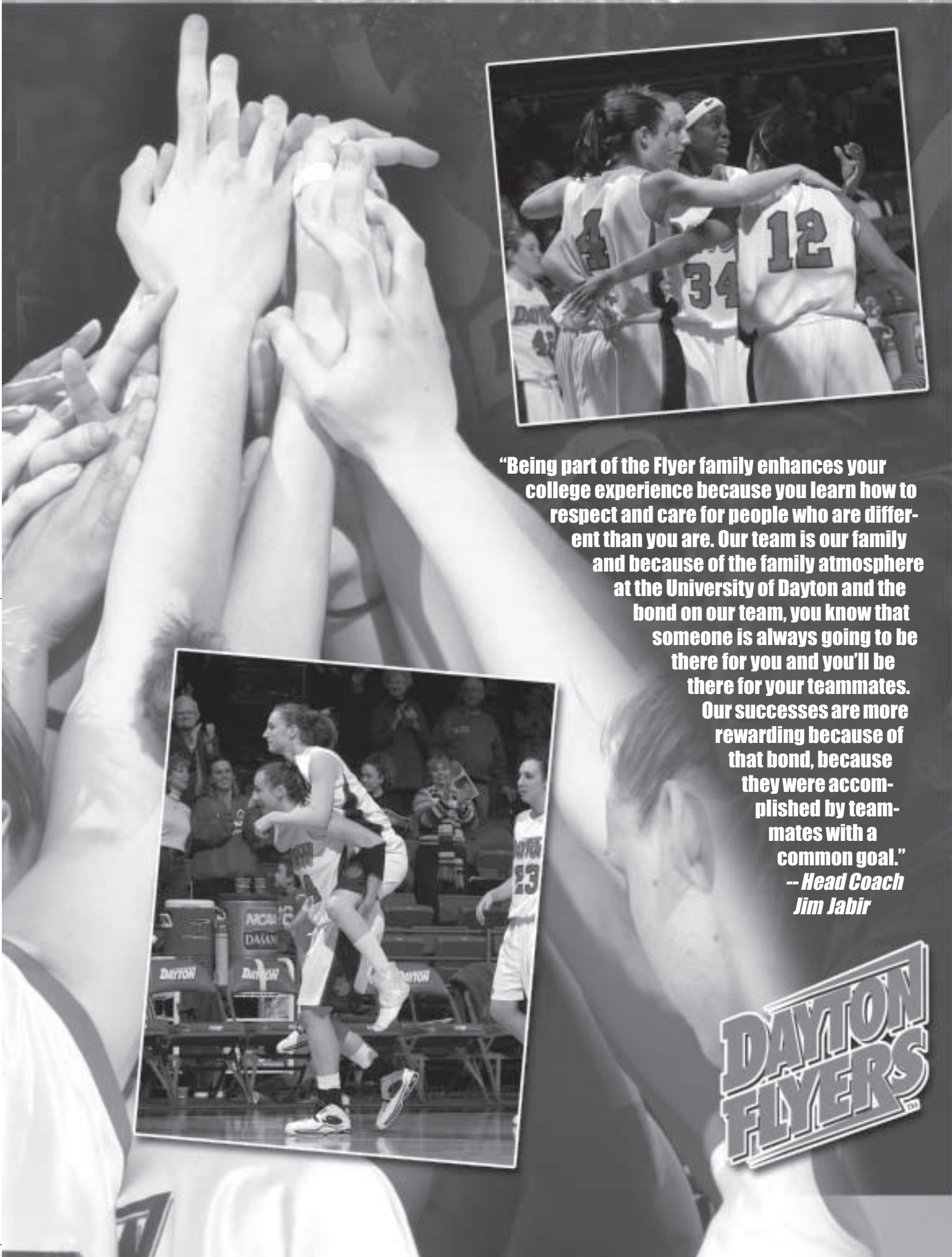

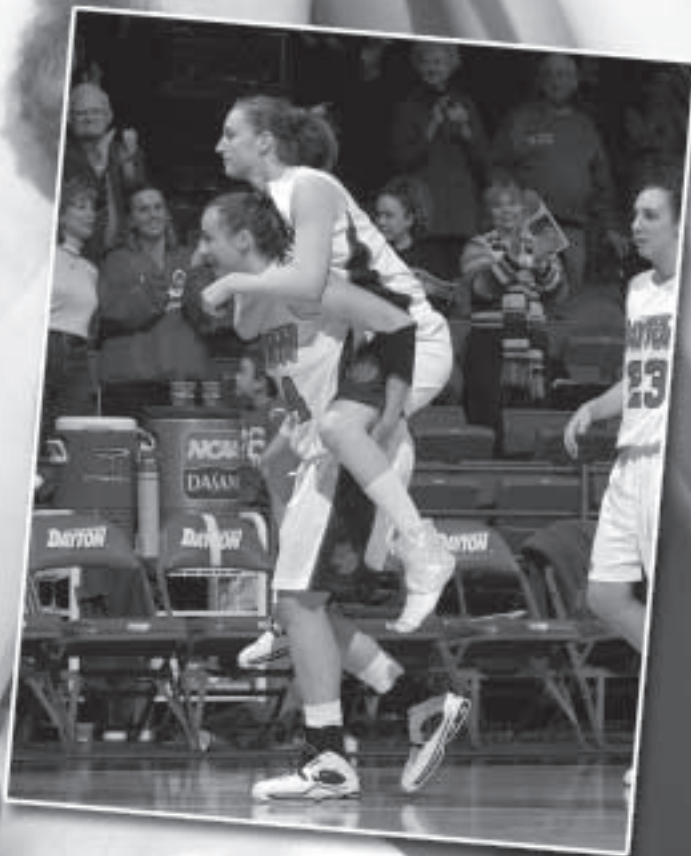

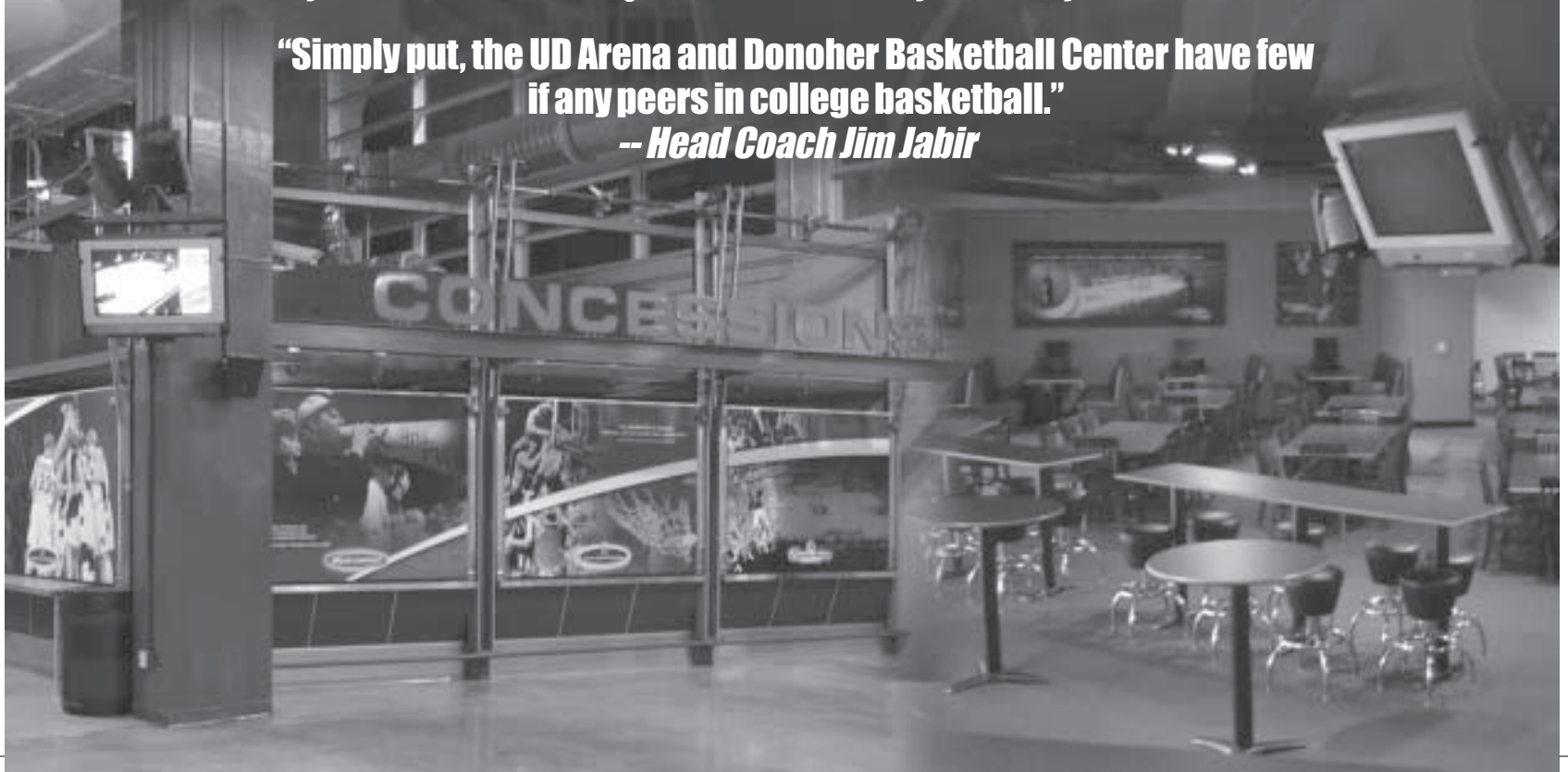
# THE UD ARENA

# DONOHER CENTER

The Donoher Basketball Center is a state-of-the-art facility that elevates the UD women's basketball program to the next level. It includes plush locker rooms for the men's and women's basketball teams, the McHale Auditorium for meetings and instruction, a strength and conditioning facility and training room designed with basketball in mind to bring out the very best in every student-athlete. Technology is at the very core of the facility's distinctiveness. An ESPN-style six-screen theater wall just inside the entrance makes it clear from the initial impression that the University of Dayton understands the necessity of bringing current technology to bear on competitive performance.

One of UD's most prominent alumni, high-tech entrepreneur John McHale, contributed much of the Center's \$4.3 million cost, with the insistence that it be named to honor UD's winningest basketball coach, Don Donoher. The name of the facility is a nod to the past; the Center itself is clear evidence of the University of Dayton's intention to stake out a leadership position at the intersection of college basketball and technology to propel the Flyers to championship performance.

# WHY DAYTON?

*world-class academics,

The University of Dayton continues to be ranked among the 10 best Catholic national universities and was selected to the top-tier category among all national universities, according to the June, 2004 issue of "America's Best Colleges" from U.S. News and World Report.

"We have built a strong foundation of academic excellence at the University of Dayton, and our reputation is growing -- evidenced by record applications for the first-year class and record sponsored research dollars," said Dr. Daniel J. Curran, president. "We're pleased that we continue to be recognized as one of the nation's truly outstanding Catholic universities. More importantly, our small class sizes and excellent retention and graduation rates reflect our strong commitment to students. The generosity of our alumni ranks among the best in the nation when compared to our peers."

Among the Catholic national universities above UD in the rankings, only the University of Notre Dame and Georgetown University boast a higher average alumni giving rate. Also among that group, UD has the second-fewest large classes, with only 2 percent of classes having 50 or more students.

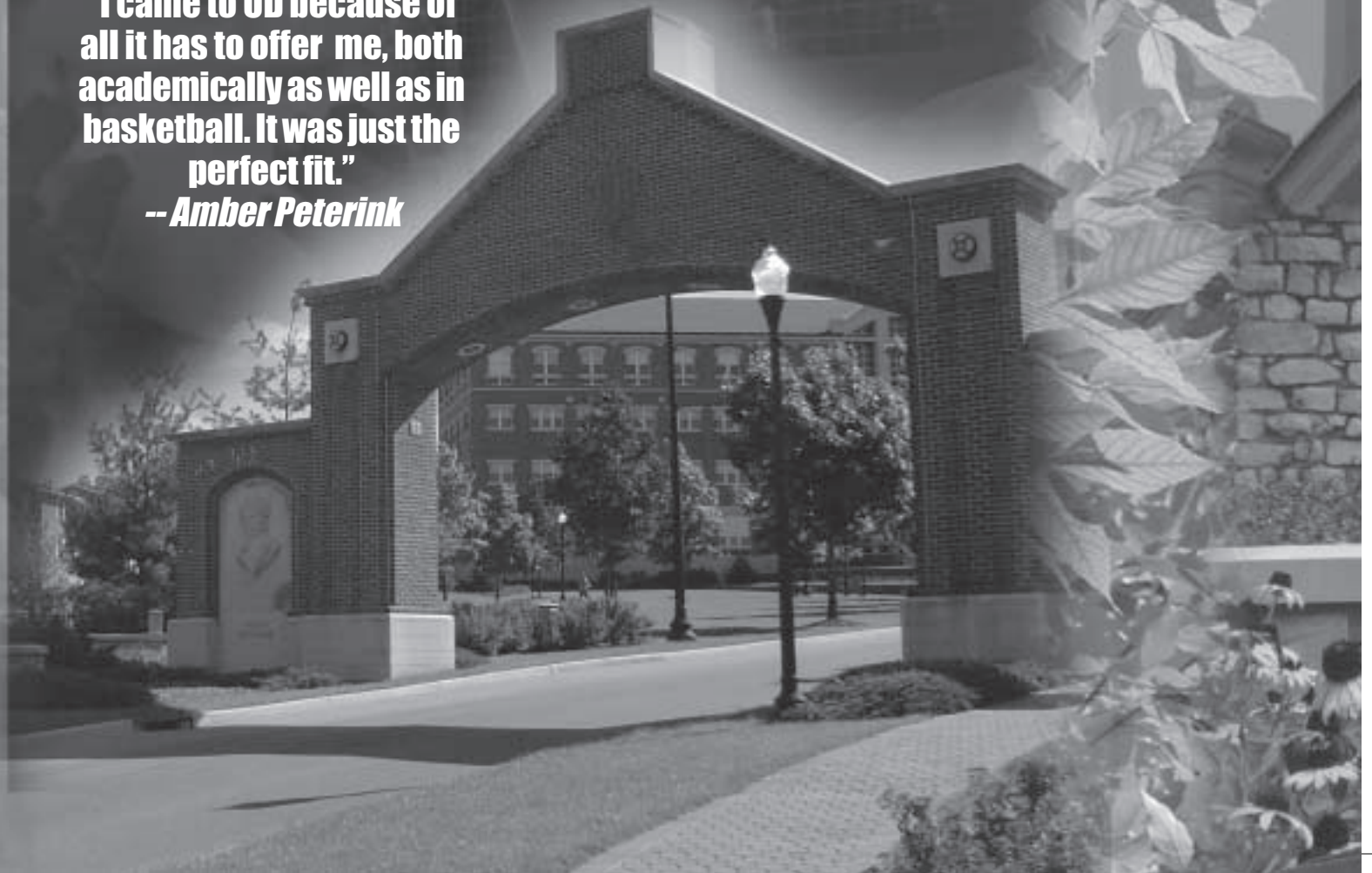
UD also scored high in retention rate (88 percent) and graduation rate (76 percent).

This is the fourth year that UD has been ranked among these 248 peer schools, which offer a wide range of undergraduate majors as well as master's and doctoral degrees. Many of the schools strongly emphasize research.

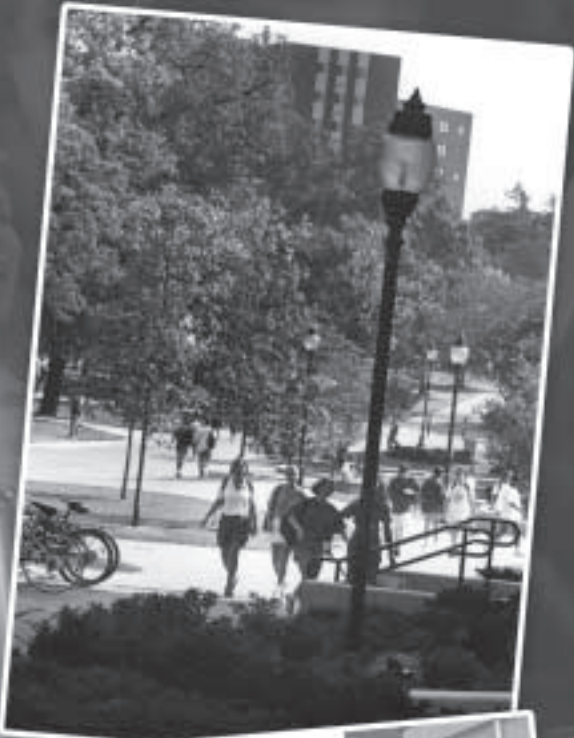
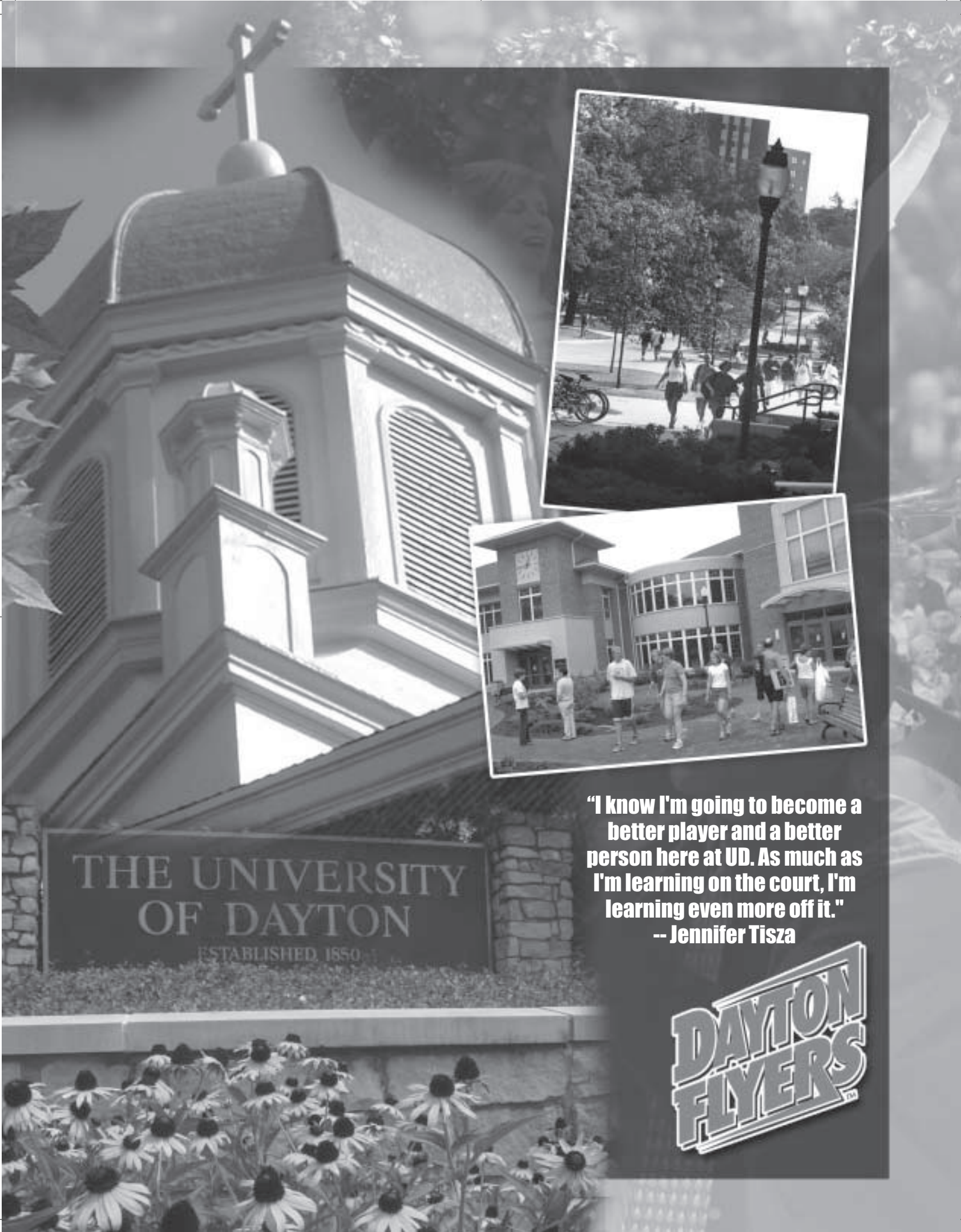
Criteria used in the rankings include peer assessment, graduation and retention ranks, faculty resources, student selectivity, financial resources and alumni giving rates. UD officials urge prospective students to use ratings to narrow their choices, but highly recommend that they visit campus before making a final selection.

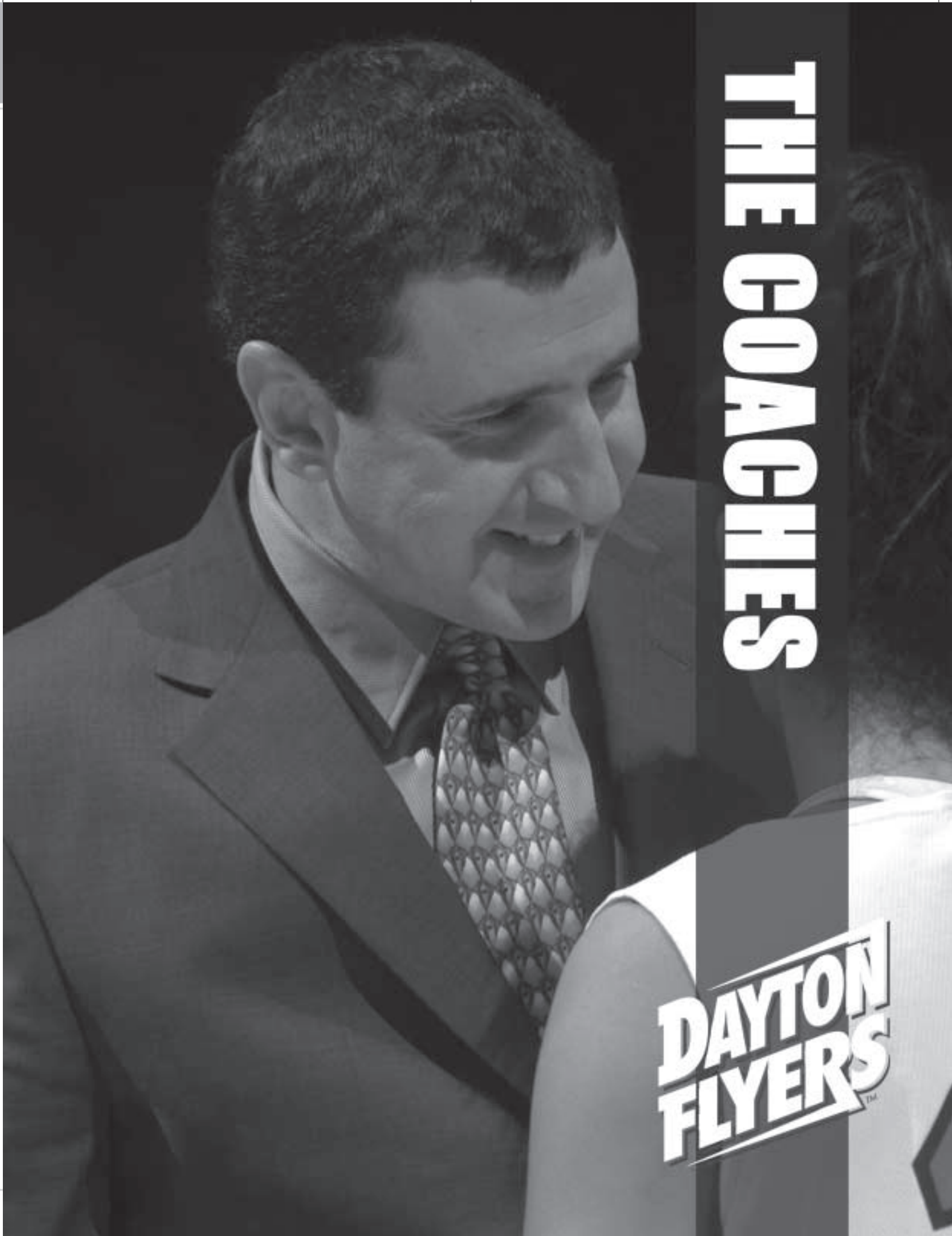

# Jim Jabir



### Third Season at Dayton • 18th Season Overall • Nazareth College '84

Hard-working. Compassionate. Dedicated. These are just a few words that come to mind when talking with Jim Jabir. On April 8, 2003, the University of Dayton introduced Jabir as the women's basketball team's eighth head coach and first male head coach in the history of the program.

Last season the Flyers posted the fourth best turnaround in the nation with an improvement of nine wins over the previous season, a trend that Jabir plans on continuing in 2005-06.

"I am going to be the hardest working coach out there," states Jabir. "I want people to fear playing the University of Dayton."

Jabir came to UD after spending one season as an assistant at Colorado. In his last season at CU, the Buffaloes (24-8) advanced to the Sweet Sixteen of the NCAA Tournament and were ranked as high as 23rd in the ESPN/Coaches' Poll and 24th in the *Associated Press* Poll. Jabir was primarily responsible for the development of CU's post players, including the Buffaloes' first-ever First Team All-Big 12 selection.

Jabir had been a head coach for 16 seasons prior to coaching at CU with an all-time career mark of 220-223. His broad coaching experience ranges from the Big East Conference to the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference.

The Brooklyn, NY native began his coaching career as an assistant at Nazareth College (1984-85) and at Buffalo State (1985-86). Jabir was instrumental in leading the Bengals to a 23-3 slate, the SUNYAC title, a 22-game winning streak, an NCAA regional tournament appearance and a national ranking (No. 3) during the 1985-86 season.

After one season as an assistant, Jabir became the head coach at Buffalo State during the 1986-87 season at the age of 24. He led that team to a 14-11 record and guided the Bengals to the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) championship and an appearance in the Division III Tournament.

Jabir matriculated to Siena College from Buffalo State, where he served as the head coach of the Saints for three seasons (1987-90) and compiled a 50-29 record. Jabir's teams posted three consecutive winning seasons. In his first season, Jabir was responsible for the development of Siena's

first-ever Freshman All-American.

After his stint at Siena, Jabir spent six years at Marquette University becoming one of the most successful coaches in the history of the program, elevating the Golden Eagles into the national spotlight. After posting a 7-20 record during his inaugural year (1990-91) at Marquette, Jabir guided his team

to four consecutive winning seasons, two 20-plus winning seasons and three post-season appearances, including back-to-back bids to the NCAA Tournament. In 1994-95, Marquette won the Great Midwest Conference Tournament, the first tournament championship in school history. This followed the 1993-94 campaign in which Jabir compiled a program-best 22-7 overall record and its first trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Before his stint at Colorado, Jabir was at the helm of Providence College for six seasons, 1996-2002. During his last three years, the Friars' record improved with each season and in his final season, the Friars finished 13-15 overall and eighth of 14 schools in the prestigious Big East, its highest finish ever since the Big East went to a one division format.

Jabir, tabbed by *Basketball Times* as one of the Top 10 up-and-coming coaches in the country, was a two-time Reebok/Great Midwest Conference Coach of the Year. Jabir is a 1984 graduate of Nazareth College in Rochester, New York, where he received a degree in English. He also earned his Masters degree in Student Personnel Administration from Buffalo State in 1986. Jabir and his wife Kathy have three children, Lauren, Shane and Jackson.

### Second Season at Dayton • Syracuse '88

Vera Jones joined the Flyers as an assistant coach at the beginning of the 2004-2005 season. The former Syracuse University standout came to the Flyers from ESPN and Madison Square Garden Network, where she served as a broadcaster for the WNBA and NCAA women's basketball for seven years.

"Vera brings a wealth of basketball knowledge, people skills and a real passion for the game," said Jabir. "She does an excellent job for us on the court and on the recruiting trail."

In addition to college and WNBA duties with "The Worldwide Leader in Sports," Jones also served as an analyst for Big Ten and Big East conference games on Fox Sports Network. She is currently an analyst for the WNBA New York Liberty on the Madison Square Garden Network in New York and has also broadcast for the Indiana Fever. Her other assignments included covering the WNBA Draft for NBA TV.

As a player with the Syracuse Orangewomen from 1984-1988, Jones was affectionately known as "Sweet V from the Top of the Key" for her ability to knock down the triple. SU's leading scorer her junior and senior seasons, she graduated as SU's all-time leader in three-point field goal percentage and seventh all-time on the Orange scoring list with over 1,000 points. She helped guide SU to its first-ever Big East Tournament Championship in 1985 and regular season championship in 1988, as well as its first two NCAA Tournament appearances (1985, 1988). In 1988, the Big East Conference named her the Women's Basketball Scholar Athlete of the Year.

In 2002, she was inducted into the Syracuse University Orange Plus Hall of Fame. Orange Plus, founded in 1979, is the support organization for women's athletics at Syracuse University.

With a bachelor's in Broadcast Journalism, Jones stayed with SU women's basketball from 1989-1991 as Graduate Assistant for Academic Advising while she completed her master's in Television and Radio.

While her broadcasting career developed, Jones maintained ties to coaching as an assistant coach at Socastee High School in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina for the girls' basketball team from 1994-1995. From 1998-99, she served as interim head coach of Edward Waters College in Jacksonville, FL. In 2002-2003, she was a consultant for River Hill High School in Columbia, Maryland.

Jones has also been a DJ or on-air personality at a variety of radio stations in her broadcasting career and was once named the South Carolina Broadcaster's Association "Personality of the Year." She also earned a Silver ADDY Award for commercial writing and production in Florida and has spent several years on stage as an actress and stand-up comedienne.

Jones currently serves as a play-by-play announcer for the MSG Network and broadcasts WNBA games for the New York Liberty.

She resides in Dayton with her son Andrew, who was born in January of 1998.

Ali Jaques joins Jim Jabir's staff at UD following three seasons at Furman University in South Carolina.

Jaques joined the Furman staff in the summer of 2002 and helped the Paladins to 52 victories in three seasons. Furman finished second in the Southern Conference in 2003-04 and third in 2004-05 after a fourth-place showing in 2002-03.

Jaques' coaching responsibilities with the Lady Paladins included team defense and working with Furman's perimeter players from 2002-04 and the post players in 2004-05. Jaques earned the Coach's Award twice and the Sixth Man Award once. She was also selected as a team captain for the 1997-98 season and graduated with a double major in broadcast journalism and German.

# Frank Goldsberry



### Third Season at Dayton • Ball State '76

Frank Goldsberry, who coached at Chaminade-Julienne High School in Dayton from 1996-2003, was responsible for guiding the Eagles to national prominence in high school girls basketball. Goldsberry led C-J to two Ohio Division II state championships (1999, 2003) and to a number one ranking in the country in 2002. The Eagles also were Division I runners-up in 1998 and 2001.

In three of the last four seasons under Goldsberry, C-J won the final AP poll. He posted an overall record of 170-16 in his seven seasons and was named Division II State Coach of the Year in 1999. He was also named the District Coach of the Year in both 1998 and 1999 and was the coach of the State Dream Team in 2001. Among Goldsberry's products include National High School Player of the Year and current Minnesota Lynx forward Tamika Williams, who helped guide Connecticut to the 2000 and 2002 NCAA Championship. He also coached Notre Dame point guard Megan Duffy and most recently Ohio State's Brandie Hoskins. He has coached six Division I players in the last eight years.

Prior to his stint at C-J, Goldsberry was head coach of the boys basketball team at Northmont High School from 1993-1996. There, he posted a 42-24 overall record and led Northmont to its first district final in 20 years. Goldsberry also served as the head boys basketball coach at Tippecanoe High School for 13 years (1979-92) where he tallied a 165-112 record. While at Tippecanoe, Goldsberry was named Southwestern Rivers Coach of the Year on four occasions.

Goldsberry graduated from Ball State University with a degree in Education. He went on to receive his master's degree in computer science from the University of Dayton.

Goldsberry currently works as the computer resource coordinator and computer science teacher at Tipp City Exempted Village Schools in Tipp City, OH. Goldsberry and his wife Paula have four children, John, Ashley, Lindsey and Robert.

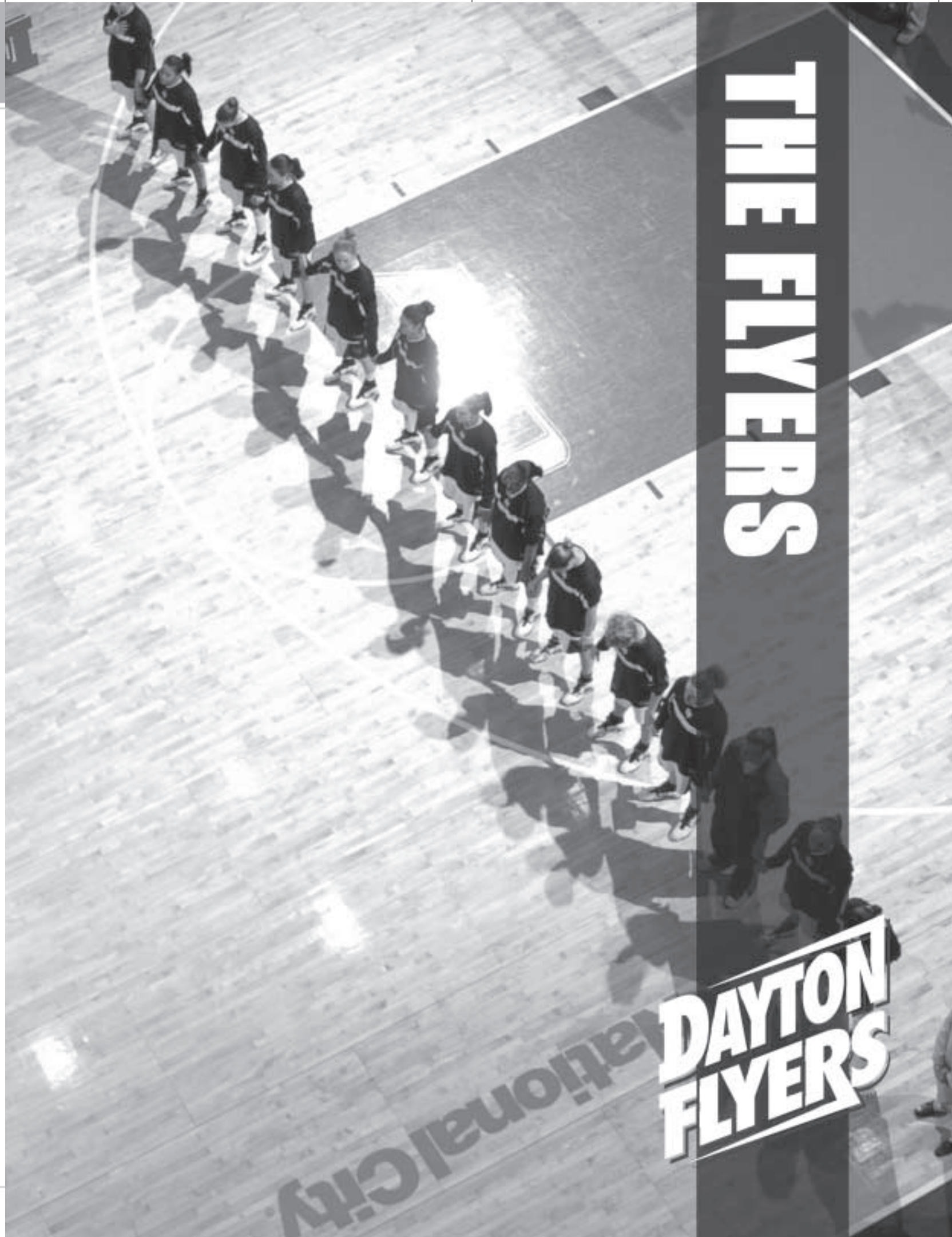

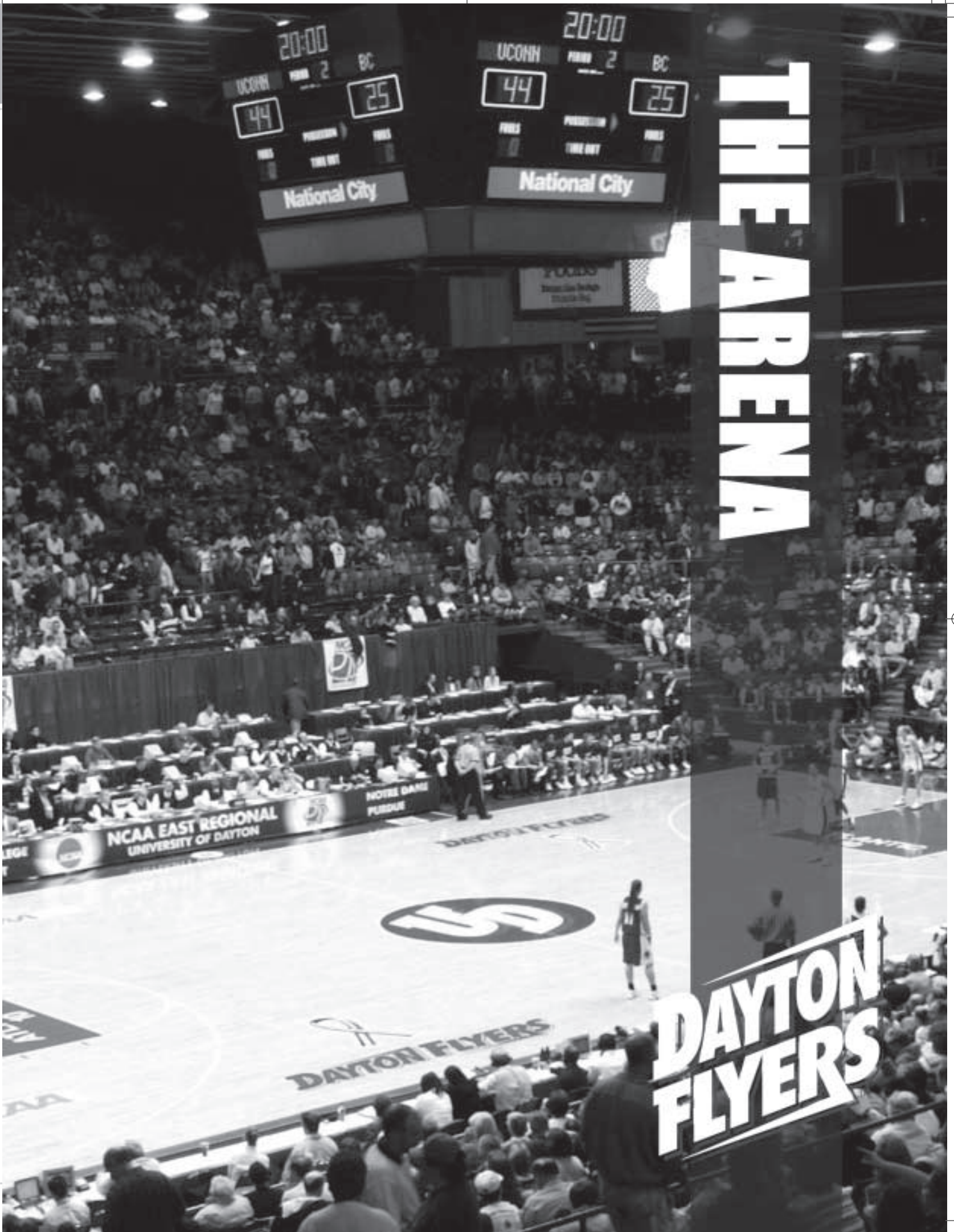

# UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON ARENA



As the University of Dayton Arena moves into its middle ages (it turned 35 on December 6, 2004), it only gets better.

In November 2002, the UD Arena re-opened after undergoing a major renovation that had been completed in a swift 10 months. Additions to the UD Arena included suites and loge seats, and the new Time Warner Cable Flight Deck -- all overlooking Blackburn Court with a powerful view of all of the action. The Boesch Lounge received a face-lift along with new restrooms and upgraded concessions for the fans. Environmental graphics were added throughout the building that tell the story of the long tradition of Dayton basketball. Overall, the facility was modernized with an eye to the future while maintaining its steadfast roots as a landmark in the Dayton community.

The Arena, built in 1969 for approximately \$4.5 million without the use of public funds, has been a tremendous host site. The Flyers' win over Duquesne on February 17, 1999 was their 500th game at UD Arena and their 350th win at the venue. In the 2002-2003 season, the Flyers won their 400th game at UD Arena, going 17-1 at home, and winning the Atlantic 10 Championship on their home floor. Nationally, the Arena is better known as a host to 19 of the last 36 NCAA Tournaments. That covers 66 games, fourth all-time behind Kansas City's Municipal Auditorium, New York's Madison Square Garden, and Salt Lake City's Huntsman Center.

During the summer of 1997, the University made two moves to forever tie the Arena with two of the greatest names in UD basketball history.

The playing court at UD Arena was named after former Flyer coach Tom Blackburn, and the \$4.5 million addition to the Arena was named for former player and coach Don Donoher. The two coaches combined for nearly 800 victories from 1947 to 1989. The playing floor is officially known as 'Tom Blackburn Court at the University of Dayton Arena,' but is referred to as 'Blackburn Court.' Blackburn coached the Flyers from 1947 until his death due to cancer in 1964. Only 58 at the time of his death, Blackburn won 352 games while being bested just 141. When he signed on at UD, the Flyers had just posted a four-win season. Four years later, his team was playing in the championship game of the most prestigious tournament of the day, the National Invitation Tournament.

The addition of the Donoher Basketball Center in 1998 was the first step in placing the facility ahead of its time. The Donoher Basketball Center, an addition to the southwest corner of the Arena, has given the Flyer basketball programs a technologically advanced facility for training, game preparation and recruiting. It now serves as the nerve center for the Flyer basketball programs, housing state-of-the-art conditioning and training rooms, locker rooms, multi-media facilities and team meeting rooms. The locker room layout incorporates an NBA-style design, combining a casually furnished lounge and meeting area within the locker room.

Named for Don Donoher at the urging of John McHale, whose \$1.25 million gift to the University initiated the project, the Center's grand debut came on June 28, 1998. The Flyer Faithful turned out 5,000 strong to visit the open house. Donoher, who coached UD to a school-record 437 wins from 1964 to 1989, took UD to the NCAA title game in 1967 and to the NIT title the following year. He led UD to the Sweet 16 in the 1970s and then the Regional Finals in the 1980s. He also won a gold medal at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics as an assistant coach of the U.S. team (which featured Michael Jordan).

In fact, the NCAA Final Four appearance in 1967 helped convince the UD administration of the need for the Arena. On November 7, 1968, the Rev. Raymond A. Roesch broke ground for the University of Dayton Arena. And with his first shovel of dirt, the then-UD president began a project that would help take college basketball from a game played in small gymnasiums to an event played to thousands of fans in magnificent arenas.

A little more than a year after the construction began, UD Arena was a reality. It opened on December 6, 1969, as the Flyers faced Bowling Green. BG's Jim Connally hit the Arena's first shot, followed by Dayton's first hoop, a jumper from Pat Murnen. The Flyers led 39-27 at half and pushed it to 43-27 before a 21-8 BG tear. From there, it was a dogfight. Senior (and future UD Hall of Famer)

George Janky, who had 26 points and 15 rebounds, sank a pair of free throws with 29 seconds left to give UD a 72-68 lead. The Falcons' Bob Quayle hit a shot at 0:17 and then stole the inbounds pass and missed a last-second shot which would have sent it into overtime. Afterward, Jim Gottschall said, "Those two free throws George made were really something. Let's face it ... he won the game." The dedication of the Arena came at halftime of the 79-75 win over DePaul on January 17. At halftime, Ohio Governor James Rhodes told the sell-out crowd, "The arena is an example of the University of Dayton's progressive attitude and showed it is one of the nation's leading universities in accomplishing this arena."

In the 30 years that have passed, more than 14 million customers have witnessed events in UD Arena. In a typical year, the Arena will host more than a half-million people at more than 100 events. The level of talent that has appeared on the floor at the Arena is staggering. The list includes the likes of Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, LeBron James, Elton John, Michael Jordan, Elvis, Isiah Thomas, Adolph Rupp, David Robinson, Aerosmith, Dean Smith, Baryshnikov, Larry Bird, Johnny Cash, Magic Johnson, and Tony Gwynn (playing basketball for San Diego State). The list goes on and on.

One of a generation of great basketball arenas built in the late 1960s and early 1970s, the 13,409-seat home of Flyer basketball was the brainchild of university movers Roesch, the Rev. Charles Collins, Brother Elmer Lackner and then-Flyer Director of Athletics Thomas J. Frericks. Planning began in 1967 amid a tremendous demand for tickets to Flyer home games. Home for the games at that time was the University of Dayton Fieldhouse, which was renamed the Thomas J. Frericks Athletic and Convocation Center in 1991. Built in 1950, the then-Fieldhouse held 5,808 fans and was sold out for its last 195 Flyer games.

The Arena made NCAA men's basketball history again in March 2001 by hosting 10 post-season games in eight days, a feat never-before done in college basketball. While other venues have hosted NCAA games and games of the National Invitation Tournament in the same year, no venue or school had ever done both simultaneously. And while UD was a gracious host to nine NCAA teams, the NIT was not kind to UD opponents as the Flyers advanced to the quarterfinals for the 10th time in 19 NIT appearances.

When the NCAA Tournament expanded to 65 teams for the first time in 2001, the NCAA placed the first-ever Opening-Round Game in Dayton, featuring the tournament's 64th and 65th seeded teams, Northwestern State and Winthrop. The Opening Round was such a success in Dayton that the NCAA declared UD Arena as the Opening Round's home from 2001 through 2008. The NCAA First and Second Rounds return to the Arena in 2006 and with the completion of that series, UD Arena will pass Madison Square Garden and become the third-most prolific NCAA Tournament venue. In addition, UD was also selected to host the Women's Basketball Regional Final in 2007.

# UD ARENA & THE NCAA TOURNAMENT



There are many reasons why the NCAA Tournament Committee has called on the University of Dayton Arena to be a host for so many NCAA Tournament games:

- The University had constructed a new (and large) arena in 1969, making it one of the most attractive venues in the country.
- The hometown Flyers had been so good for so long that the college basketball fans in the Miami Valley were among the most knowledgeable and supportive in the country.
- Dayton's Director of Athletics Thomas J. Frericks was an influential member of the tournament committee and a visionary regarding how to host a tournament.
- After hosting so many times, the NCAA often sent those chosen to host to Dayton, to witness the model of how to host the tournament.

Pick whatever reason you want, but there is certainly no argument that the UD Arena has been the site of more memorable NCAA Tournament moments than any facility in history. Among the Arena memories...

*Notre Dame's Austin Carr scored 35 points against Ohio University -- in the first half. He added 26 more after intermission and holds the single-game mark to this day.*

*Adolph Rupp's Kentucky Wildcats fell to Florida State in 1972, ending his amazing career that resulted in 875 victories.*

*Kentucky handed Bobby Knight's Hoosiers their only loss in a two-year, 64-game span in what was called college basketball's greatest game until Christian Laettner eliminated UK in Philadelphia in 1992*

*The world was introduced to a magical freshman from Michigan State in 1978. But the Spartans title would wait a year as soon-to-be champ Kentucky knocked out Magic Johnson, handing him his only NCAA Tourney loss.*

*Mark Aguirre's agony as he gripped the ball after it had gone through the net to beat his top-ranked DePaul Blue Demons in his final collegiate game -- a loss to Saint Joseph's.*

*Indiana trouncing the Maryland Terrapins en route to winning the 1981 NCAA Title with sophomore Isiah Thomas leading the way in his final collegiate season.*

*In a simple 1984 play-in game, referee Mickey Crowley, former Supervisor of Atlantic 10 Men's Basketball Officials, ran to the ESPN announcing position to watch a replay to determine whom to send to the foul line.*

*One amazing day in 1985: Fairleigh Dickinson nearly beat powerful Michigan, Villanova started its dream run to the NCAA Championship (against the Dayton Flyers no less), Len Bias and Maryland stole one from Ron Harper and the Miami Redskins and David Robinson jumped into the nation's conscious as Navy decimated LSU.*

*One year later, another amazing freshman took to the floor in Kansas' Danny Manning while Michigan State's Scott Skiles fought and clawed his way to the regional while making a remarkable around-the-body pass on a breakaway.*

*Ohio State, led by Jimmy Jackson and hometown hero Mark Baker (a Dunbar High School grad), knocked out Georgia Tech and then Jackson announced that Kenny Anderson was going pro.*

*After going 0-3 in NCAA Tournament Games at the UD Arena, the 1995 Miami Redskins shocked the Arizona Wildcats behind the dreadlocked Devin Davis.*

*The North Carolina State women knocking off the top two seeds in the East -- UConn and Old Dominion -- to advance to the 1998 Final Four.*

In 2001, UD Arena became just the fourth venue to host 60 Men's NCAA Tournament Games -- joining Kansas City's Municipal Auditorium, Madison Square Garden and Salt Lake City's Huntsman Center. Also that week, Syracuse defeated Hawai'i giving Orange head coach Jim Boeheim his 600th career coaching victory.

That year also featured the first-ever Opening Round Game. Held at UD Arena, the Northwestern State Demons defeated the Winthrop Eagles as the field was expanded to 65 teams for the first time ever. The Opening Round game was such a success in Dayton that the NCAA elected to hold the game at UD Arena through 2008.

In three years, the Opening Round Game has become one of the most exciting and entertaining games of the NCAA Tournament. In 2002, Prosper Karangwa of Siena scored 31 points to lead his Siena Saints to an 81-77 win over Alcorn State and legendary coach Davey L. Whitney. The 2003 NCAA Tournament was known for its close games and exciting finishes, and the Opening Round set the tone as UNC Asheville and Texas Southern found themselves knotted at 75-75 at the end of regulation. UNC Asheville, making its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, came away with a 92-84 win in overtime.

In 2003, the Women's NCAA Tournament returned to Dayton for the East Regional. Not only did the four teams who visited UD Arena feature the defending National Champion Connecticut Huskies, but also the four previous National Champions: Connecticut, who also won the title in 2000, 2001 Champion Notre Dame, and Purdue, who won it all in 1999. Connecticut survived the bracket of champions and went on to take the 2003 National Championship.

# ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE



On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 14-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10. The University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Temple University, and Xavier University have formed the foundation of the Atlantic 10 - a foundation which is further strengthened this season with the additions of the University of North Carolina at Charlotte and Saint Louis University.

In 2005-06, the Atlantic 10 Conference celebrates its 30th anniversary season. Although anniversaries are a good time to reflect, this anniversary is a celebration of the future as much as the past. "It is with pride that we look back at our accomplishments and see how far this league has truly come," says A-10 commissioner Linda Bruno, who begins her 12th season at the helm of the league - the longest tenure of any commissioner in the Conference's history. "More importantly, however, the additions of Charlotte and Saint Louis ensure that the future is brighter than it has ever been. We are adding two members who will greatly enhance the national profile of all our sports and expose our programs to two new markets in which our universities actively recruit. The A-10 has never been as strong as it is now."

The Atlantic 10 Conference, which spans eight states and the District of Columbia with a total population of almost 73 million people, will crown champions in 21 sports this season: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The genesis of this tradition of success can be traced to March 2, 1975, when eight university representatives met in Harrisburg, PA, to discuss the formation of a new collegiate basketball association. A similar meeting was also held on May 23 of that year, with the final formation of the Eastern Collegiate Basketball League announced on August 13, 1975. The NCAA granted allied affiliation status upon the ECBL on October 15, 1975, and granted the league an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament on June 17, 1976.

The ECBL began operation at the start of the 1976-77 season with Duquesne, George Washington, Massachusetts, Penn State, Pittsburgh, Rutgers, Villanova, and West Virginia as its charter members. Several changes happened quickly in the ECBL, the first coming in 1977-78 when the league changed its name to the Eastern Athletic Association - better known as the Eastern 8 - to reflect its changing mission. That year, the Eastern 8 became more than a basketball league as the men's sports of baseball, cross country, golf, swimming, and tennis were added to the championship schedule.



The next major change came in 1981 when the office of the commissioner was instituted. Leland Byrd, who had served as president and executive director of the league since its inception, as well as athletic director at West Virginia, was named the Conference's first commissioner and established the commissioner's office in Pittsburgh. Byrd guided the Eastern 8 through several membership changes as Rhode Island, St. Bonaventure, Saint Joseph's, and Temple replaced Pittsburgh and Villanova.

After membership stabilized, the Eastern 8 transformed into the Atlantic 10 Conference with Byrd orchestrating the drive to make the league more broad-based as the women's sports of basketball, gymnastics, softball, tennis, and volleyball were added to the championship slate.

In May 1984, Byrd resigned as commissioner and was replaced by Charlie Theokas, who remained at the Atlantic 10 for 15 and a half months, bringing the league to national consciousness with his "Think Atlantic 10" campaign. On December 31, 1985, Theokas resigned to accept the athletic director's position at Temple and was replaced by Ron Bertovich, who officially assumed the commissioner's position in May 1986 after serving as interim commissioner following Theokas' departure. In eight years as commissioner, Bertovich expanded the Conference staff to better meet the growing needs of the membership and established the Atlantic 10 Television Network, which has developed into a major regional outlet and has won three Emmy Awards. In addition, he oversaw further membership changes as Xavier was added to the league while Penn State, Rutgers, and West Virginia departed. Furthermore, he continued the league's emphasis on broad-based programs as the Atlantic 10 expanded its championship list with the additions of women's cross country, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, women's swimming & diving, and men's and women's indoor track & field, as well as the reinstatement of men's swimming & diving.

On April 13, 1994, Bertovich resigned his position to accept the job of vice president and general manager of Empire Sports Network in Buffalo. On June 14, 1994, Linda Bruno was officially introduced as the Atlantic 10's fourth commissioner. As commissioner, Bruno has strengthened the Atlantic 10's membership with the additions of Charlotte, Dayton, Fordham, La Salle, Richmond, and Saint Louis. She also negotiated television deals with ESPN and was among the first to sign a contract with College Sports Television, which provides greater exposure for the Atlantic 10's athletic programs. Under her leadership, the Atlantic 10 has increased its championship schedule to 21 sports with the additions of women's rowing, men's and women's outdoor track & field, and women's lacrosse. In 1997, Bruno also spearheaded the league's entrance into Division I football with the formation of the Atlantic 10 Football Conference, which has won three national titles in its eight-year existence. In addition, in an effort to recognize the athletic and academic achievements of all student-athletes, Bruno instituted the Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 gpa or better.



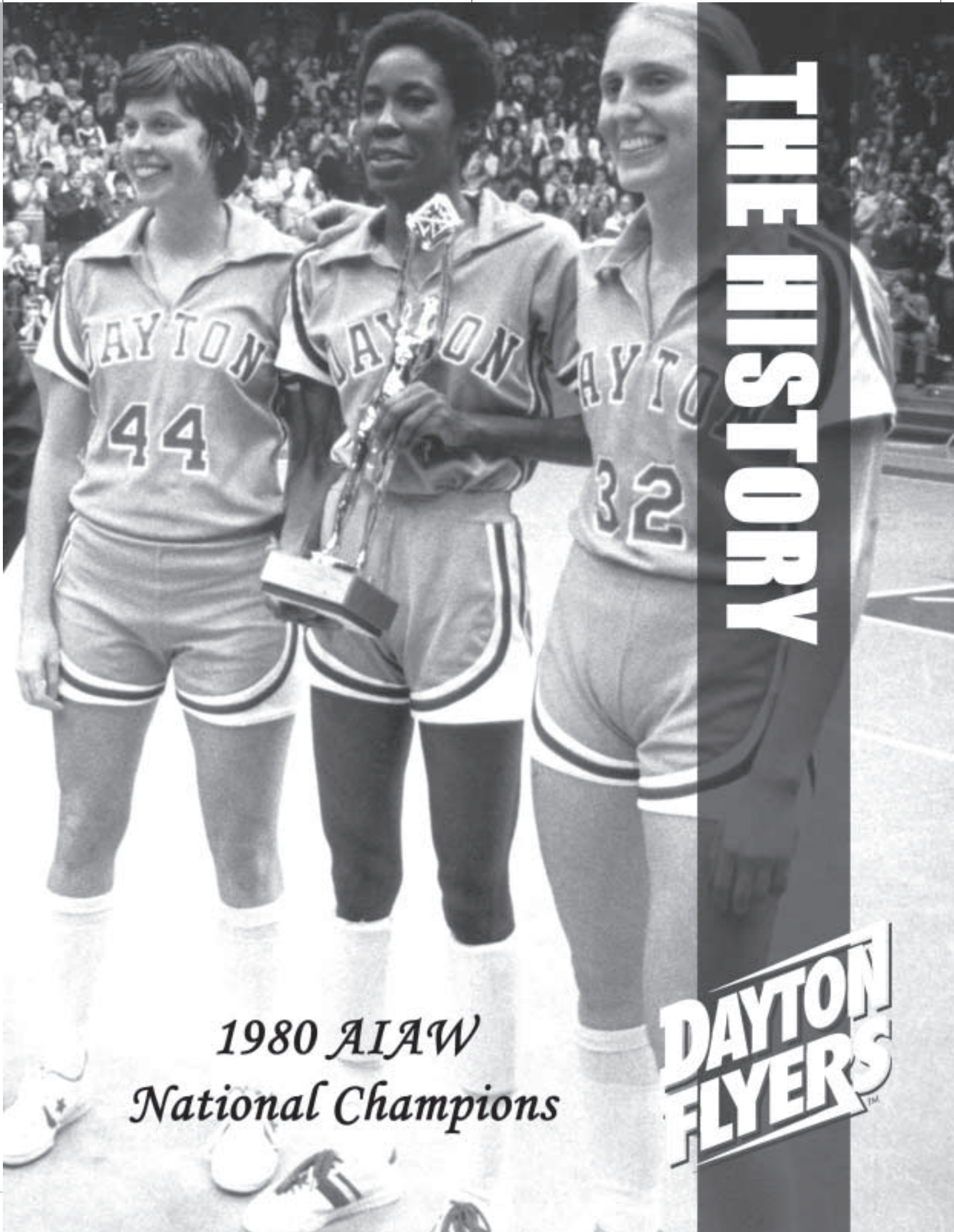

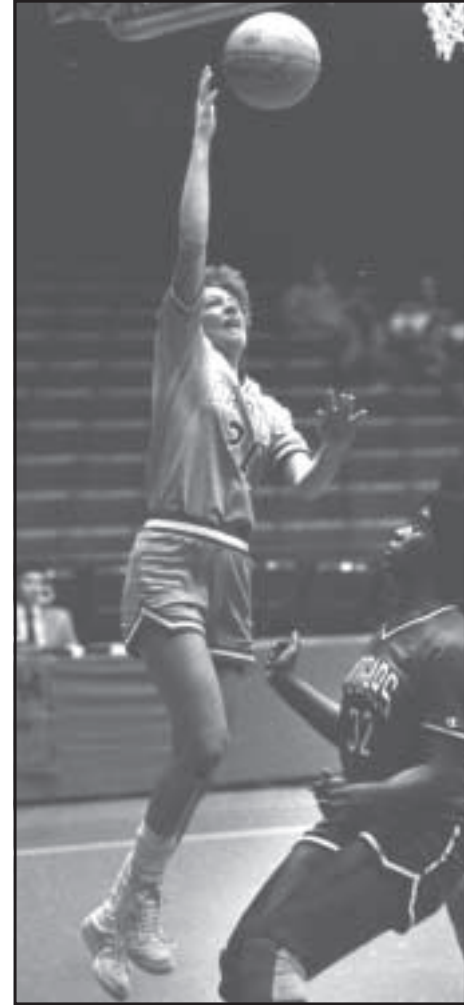

**Thomas J. Frericks**, who became a member of the UD Athletics Hall of Fame in 1976, left an indelible impression on the Flyer Athletics program. No mention of University of Dayton tournament appearances would be complete without acknowledging the contributions of Mr. Frericks, who served as UD's director of athletics from 1964 to 1992.

Not only should he be considered for the University's involvement in tournaments, but for his contributions to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship.

Mr. Frericks was an innovator who helped guide UD Athletics from a time when collegiate athletic departments were low-budget operations to the multi-million dollar budgets of today. Through all the changes, one thing remained constant, because of Frericks' dedication, UD became known for integrity and credibility.

Highlights of his tenure included UD's second-place finish in the 1967 NCAA Men's Basketball Championship, and the construction in 1969 of the \$4.5 million University of Dayton Arena, which has now hosted 65 NCAA Tournament Games (62 men, three women).

As a member of the Men's Basketball Committee, Frericks was an integral part of developing the tournament to the great American sporting event, "March Madness," it is today. He was on the five-member team from the Basketball Committee that negotiated the seven-year, \$1 billion television contract with CBS Sports. Mr. Frericks was slated to be the Chair of the Basketball Committee starting in 1992, but he lost his battle with cancer on Jan. 31, 1992, before presiding over any championship.

Fifteen days prior to his passing, the University had rededicated the University of Dayton Fieldhouse as the Thomas J. Frericks Athletic and Convocation Center. It serves as a constant reminder, fittingly, in a building where he attended classes, practiced and played as a young man and transformed UD athletic fortunes as athletic director.

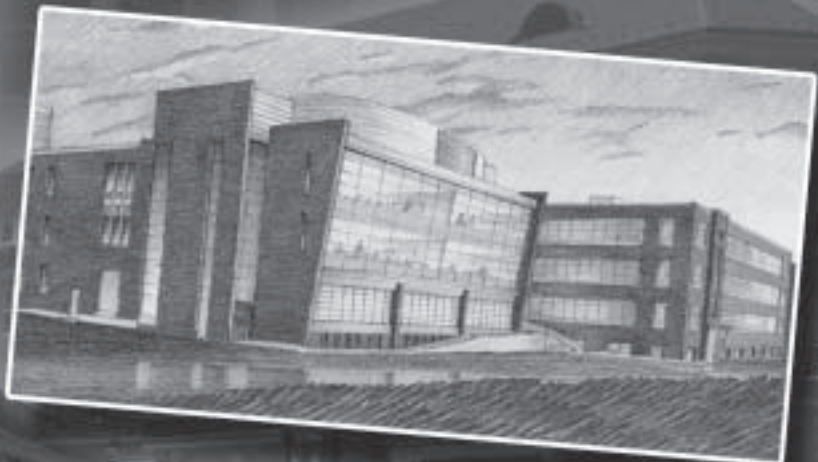

### •Volleyball

An extensive seating renovation and environmental graphics package was completed during the summer of 2004. The facility is named for the late Thomas J. Frericks, the Flyers' longtime Director of Athletics, and was the former home of Dayton Basketball.

### •Football

Located adjacent to the UD Arena, the 11,000-seat Welcome Stadium (named for the late Percival Welcome, longtime Director of Athletics for the City of Dayton Public Schools) features a video replay scoreboard, lights and turf. The Flyers have won nearly 85 percent of their games at Welcome Stadium.

## Dr. Daniel J. Curran

**President**



Daniel J. Curran leads one of the top 10 Catholic universities in the United States and the largest independent university in Ohio. The Philadelphia native became the University of Dayton's 18th president and first lay leader on July 1, 2002.

He's collaborating with administrators and faculty to craft Vision 2010: A Commitment to Excellence, a long-range strategic plan that will expand the University of Dayton's reputation as a Catholic leader in higher education, extend its reach globally and improve diversity on campus.

Under Dr. Curran's leadership, the University of Dayton is enjoying tremendous momentum. For the past two years, UD attracted record applications for its first-year class and record sponsored research dollars. The University started new exchange programs in China, established centers of excellence in nanotechnology and fuels and combustion and opened a \$22 million science center. In addition, UD constructed two facilities that combine living and learning — Marianist Hall, a modern residence hall with learning spaces, and ArtStreet, an imaginative housing and arts education complex in the student neighborhood. RecPlex, a fitness and recreation complex, is expected to open in 2006.

As a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association's Division I board of directors, he helped shape academic reforms designed to improve the graduation rate of student-athletes. He's currently serving on the NCAA's sports wagering task force.

He has quickly immersed himself in the region, focusing on economic development and high-tech issues. He chairs the Wright Brothers Institute board and serves on nearly two dozen others, including the Dayton Development Coalition, Dayton Area Chamber of Commerce, National Composite Center and Miami Valley Research Foundation. In the state, the governor tapped him for the Ohio Aerospace and Defense Advisory Council.

Colleagues praise him for his collegial leadership style, vision, energy, approachability and strong commitment to social justice.

A sociologist by training, Dr. Curran spent 23 years in various administrative and faculty positions at Saint Joseph's University in Philadelphia, most recently as executive vice president and vice president for academic affairs. He's a noted scholar in criminology, juvenile justice and social problems, with a deep interest in international issues.

His passion for social justice runs deep. At his presidential installation ceremony in April 2003, he noted that a Catholic university must be "a force for social change. As a community of learners and educators, we must analyze the causes of social injustice and educate professionals with a conscience."

He has served on the boards of Saint Joseph's Carpenter Society, a nonprofit organization that purchases and rehabilitates homes in Camden, N.J., and Philadelphia's Summerbridge Program, a college-prep program for minority middle-school students. For six years, he traveled with students to Tijuana, Mexico, on a service-learning project. He received the 2002 Eternal Flame Award, an international award given for "exceptional contribution to the field of Holocaust education."

Most of Dr. Curran's research has focused on ways to address social inequality. His prolific scholarly record includes eight books, most of which he co-authored with his wife, Claire M. Renzetti, former chair of the sociology department at Saint Joseph's University. Theories of Crime: A Reader was published in 2003, and the two are working on updated editions of Women, Men and Society: The Sociology of Gender and Social Problems: Society in Crisis. In 1993, the University of Pittsburgh Press published his Dead Laws for Dead Men, a historical analysis of coal mine health and safety legislation.

Before becoming a vice president at Saint Joseph's University, Dr. Curran served as dean of the College of Arts and Sciences for four years. He started his academic career there in 1979 with a series of faculty positions in the department of sociology, including chair from 1988 to 1992. As a professor of sociology, he has taught courses in criminology, social problems, juvenile justice and white-collar crime. Dr. Curran also served as president of the faculty senate at Saint Joseph's University.

In 1990, he served as a Fulbright Senior Scholar at the University of Melbourne in Australia. He holds a concurrent professorship at Nanjing University in China.

Dr. Curran earned a Ph.D. from the University of Delaware in 1980 after receiving a master's degree from Temple University in 1978 and a bachelor's degree from Saint Joseph's University in 1973—all in sociology. Dr. Curran and his wife, Claire, have two sons, Sean and Aidan.

## Ted Kissell

**Vice President/Director of Athletics**



Ted Kissell begins his 13th year as Vice President/Director of Athletics at the University of Dayton. Kissell's tenure at UD has seen the Athletics Division transform into a widely-successful broad-based program to keep in step with the changing trends in college athletics.

As Kissell has implemented his strategic plan, championships have followed. In the last eight years (1998-2005), UD has won 22 conference championships and seen 16 teams reach post-season. In the eight years prior to that (1990-98), the Flyers only had seven conference championships and one tournament appearance.

Only the sixth AD in school history, Kissell is charged with the oversight of 17 intercollegiate athletics programs, the University of Dayton Arena and the surrounding Arena Sports Complex. As a University Vice President, Kissell serves on the University's President's Council and is a member of the President's Cabinet. Beyond the University, he is chair of Atlantic 10 Conference Finance Committee and a member of the A-10 Executive Committee.

A vital component of the Flyer master plan is a men's basketball program that is in consistent contention for a post-season bid. The progress of the men's basketball program in the last seven years toward greater national prominence has been marked by three NCAA bids; three NIT bids and an average of more than 20 wins a season. Annual basketball-related revenues have risen from \$1.8 million to \$8.8 million since Kissell came to UD in 1992.

The success of the men's basketball program has provided resources and allowed the operating budget to grow nearly \$10 million to support Kissell's strategy of building broad-based competitive results throughout Flyer sports programs. Women's soccer has earned five NCAA tournament appearances including a berth in the "Sweet Sixteen" in 2001 and has won eight of the last nine A-10 regular season championships. Women's volleyball has earned two consecutive NCAA tournament appearances and has won five A-10 titles (regular season and/or tournament). Men's soccer has won four A-10 titles, and baseball has raised the school record for wins in a season three times in the last five years.

Kissell has also invested in UD football to maintain its position as the model for Division I non-scholarship football programs. A grass practice facility and charter flights have advanced UD's competitive position. UD football has gained nationwide attention with 28 consecutive winning seasons and won outright or shared the Pioneer Football League championship eight of the 12 years the league has been in existence. The Flyers also won the 2002 NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major National Championship. Strong performance on the field has not come at the expense of a high level of performance in the classroom. The Flyers' combined cumulative grade point average has steadily risen to 3.14, the best in school history. UD has had 25 Academic All-Americans in the last five years. Only Nebraska, Rensselaer Poly and Rice had more. Dayton's 174 student-athletes on the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll were the third-most in the conference, even though the Flyers participate in fewer A-10 sports than all but one school.

Providing strong, positive experiences and support for student-athletes is paramount in developing competitive athletic programs. During the last eight years, the Athletics Division has added full-time staff in the areas of academic support, strength and conditioning and athletic training.

UD's student-athletes are also educated on the subjects of time management, better nutrition and even

public speaking. Travel to away athletics contests has been upgraded across the board to provide the better accommodations and itineraries for athletes to be able to focus on academics while on the road and minimize the amount of class time missed.

A high-water mark of Kissell's administration is the implementation of a gender equity plan that provides men and women student-athletes with equitable opportunities in line with the university's general population. A U.S. News & World Report ranks UD in the top 15 in Division I gender equity. Additionally, the Athletics Division has worked with the University to implement an aggressive program to increase minority opportunities for student-athletes.

Kissell's plan also includes improved facilities. Development of the Arena Sports Complex (a 25-acre project in full view of I-75 and an attractive southern gateway to the city of Dayton) began with a \$13 million renovation to the University of Dayton Arena, completed in 2002. Since then, the University has added a running track, the Jerry Von Mohr Football Practice Field, Time Warner Cable Stadium for baseball and a softball stadium that was completed for the 2005 season. The next ingredient will be the "Courtyard By Marriott at the University of Dayton" that will open during the 2005-06 school year. Along with the hotel, future plans include a restaurant, a multi-use field and farther down the Great Miami River, a boathouse for the rowing team.

The Arena Sports Complex is the most visible of the upgrades, but every locker room in the Frericks Center has also been renovated, along with venue upgrades for soccer and volleyball.

A native of Chicago, Kissell holds two history degrees - a B.A. from Elmhurst College in 1969 and an M.A. from Northern Illinois University in 1972. Ted's family includes his wife Deanna, four children - Ted Jr., Jennifer, Sarah and Katie, and one grandson, Teo.





## Tim Wabler

### Associate Vice President for Athletics



Tim Wabler begins his 11th year in athletics at the University of Dayton. A former Flyer student-athlete himself, Wabler's primary duties include the administration of all of UD's sports programs and support services.

In the decade Wabler has been part of the Dayton Athletics Division, the Flyers have experienced significantly improved competitive success. In the last eight years, UD has had 22 conference championships and 16 teams reach the post-season. In the eight years prior to that, the Flyers only had seven conference championships and one tournament appearance.

The highlights include a fourth-place finish in the 2001-02 Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Cup (all-sport) standings, its best-ever finish. In 2003-04, three Flyer teams advanced to the NCAA tournament in the same school year, the very first time that happened in UD history. Women's soccer has won the A-10 Championship seven years in a row and advanced to NCAA play five of the past six years. Men's basketball has averaged more than 20 wins a season over the last six years. The volleyball team earned its first NCAA bid in 2003 by winning the A-10 Tournament, and returned to the tournament with another conference title in 2004. Men's cross country has won the national cross country only championship the last two times it has entered the meet. The baseball team has reached or surpassed the UD record for wins in a season three times in the last five seasons. And the Flyer football team has won the Pioneer Football League championship eight times in the 12-year history of the league.

As success on the field has improved, UD student-athletes have also performed in the classroom. The Flyers' combined cumulative grade point average has steadily risen to 3.14, the best in school history. UD has had 25 Academic All-Americans in the last five years. Only Nebraska, Rensselaer Poly and Rice had more. Dayton's 174 student-athletes on the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll were the third-most in the conference, even though the Flyers participate in fewer A-10 sports than all but one school. UD had the most players on the PFL Academic Honor Roll for the fourth straight year in 2004.

Wabler managed the implementation of a gender equity plan that provides men and women student-athletes with equitable opportunities in line with the university's general population. A U.S. News & World Report ranks UD in the top 15 in Division I gender equity. Additionally, the Athletics Division has worked with the University to implement an aggressive program to increase minority opportunities for student-athletes.

Wabler is overseeing the Athletics' Division efforts to provide top-notch facilities for the next generation of Flyer student-athletes with the creation of the Arena Sports Complex. Development of the Arena Sports Complex began with a \$13 million renovation to the University of Dayton Arena, completed in 2002. Since then, the University has added a running track, the Jerry Von Mohr Football Practice Field, Time Warner Cable Stadium for baseball and a softball stadium that was completed for the 2005 season. The next ingredient will be the Courtyard By Marriott at the University of Dayton that will open during the 2005-06 school year. Along with the hotel, future plans include a restaurant, a multi-use field and farther down the Great Miami River, a boathouse for the rowing team.

Early in Wabler's tenure, the Athletics Division built the \$4.3 million Donohoe Basketball Center, an addition to the UD Arena, to provide new facilities for men's and women's basketball and football. The entire facility, which was dedicated in June of 1998, was conceived, planned and completed in 20 months time. In those 20 months, the entire \$4.3 million cost was paid for by charitable gifts to the University. On campus, renovations to Baujan Field (soccer) and the Frericks Center (volleyball) have improved those facilities to among the best in the Midwest.

Including the Arena Seating Plan, gifts to Athletics total over \$4.5 million annually.

Wabler, a Dayton native, is in charge of all coaches' contracts for the Athletics Division, and manages radio and TV agreements. Wabler is also the administrator who oversees UD's athletic fund-raising efforts and long-term finances. Radio and television agreements have been expanded to increase exposure for Flyer athletics. Dayton had a record 30 men's basketball games on television last year. Football and basketball games are heard internationally on the World Wide Web. UD women's basketball is also broadcast on News/Talk 1290 WHIO. In addition, Flyer basketball, football, volleyball and soccer games are broadcast in the Dayton area on Time Warner Cable.

Wabler has been actively involved in numerous A-10 Conference committees, including the Championships Review Committee, Baseball Committee and Soccer Committee.

A 1974 graduate of UD's School of Business Administration, Wabler has also completed the Sports Management Institute Executive Program. A former member of UD's Athletic Board, Wabler was a four-year letterwinner and three-time Pitcher of the Year for UD. He served as team captain as a senior. Tim and his wife Arlene have two daughters, Sarah and Leigh Anne.

## Cindy Hartmann

### Associate Director of Athletics/ Senior Woman Administrator



Cindy Hartmann, a member of the University of Dayton athletics staff for the past seven years, serves as associate director of athletics and senior woman administrator. She is responsible for the development, implementation and adherence to the University's policies and procedures in accordance with NCAA, Atlantic 10 and University regulations as well as managing the office of academic services for student-athletes. She manages the National Letter of Intent program along with allocation and distribution of athletic grant-in-aid, and also serves as sports program administrator for women's basketball, volleyball and softball.

In June 2002, Hartmann was selected to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee in which she is entering her last year of a four-year term. She is also a member of the Atlantic 10 Women's Basketball Committee. She is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators. She currently serves on the University of Dayton Inclusion and Diversity Council and the University's Rector's Council. In 2001-02, she served as a representative to the NCAA Academic/Eligibility/Compliance Cabinet.

Before coming to Dayton, Hartmann worked at the University of Connecticut, where she served as compliance coordinator from 1996-1998. Prior to that, she was assistant compliance coordinator for one year. Hartmann served as sports information director at Georgia Perimeter College (known then as DeKalb College) from 1994-95. Hartmann has a Masters in Education-Sports Administration from Georgia State University and a Bachelor of Science degree in communication/photojournalism from Syracuse University. She was a four-year basketball letterwinner for the Orangewomen. Cindy and her husband, Troy, reside in Springboro, Ohio, with their two children, Samuel and Olivia.

## Michael O'Hare Ph.D.

### Faculty Representative



Dr. Michael O'Hare, Professor of Physics and Professor of Electro-Optics, was named faculty representative to the NCAA in 1998. Dr. O'Hare has been in the Department of Physics at the University of Dayton since 1966 and has served as chair of the department since 1983. Dr. O'Hare has Aphysics at all levels and has research experience in atomic, molecular, solid-state and optical physics.

He has served as a consultant and visiting scientist to the Wright-Patterson Air Force Materials Laboratory. Most recently, Dr. O'Hare was a co-principal investigator on a NASA sponsored NOVA grant to design curricula for developing scientific literacy in preservice teachers.

Dr. O'Hare's duties as faculty representative to the NCAA include: taking an active role in the institutional control of the intercollegiate athletics program; representing a faculty viewpoint and faculty oversight and advice in the administration of the athletics program; involvement in the assurance of academic integrity of the athletics program and the maintenance of the welfare of the student-athletes; and monitoring of performance of the student-athletes.

**The mission of the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics at the University of Dayton reflects the mission of the University by using the laboratory of fields of play and arenas of competition to educate young people to “LEARN, LEAD AND SERVE.”**

*That mission is embodied in the following core purposes:*

- To educate the total person by integrating the primary academic purposes with educational possibilities and opportunities for young people beyond the classroom;
- To teach the value of community and family through collaboration and teamwork;
- To instill the fundamentals of sportsmanship, adhering to the values of respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility;
- To teach the tools of achievement, including self-discipline, personal responsibility and the setting of high standards;
- To develop the individual talents of our student-athletes within the context of shared team goals;
- To enhance diversity and minority opportunity at the University of Dayton; and
- To advance the University of Dayton locally, regionally and nationally.

## Academic Services

The mission of Academic Services for Student-Athletes at the University of Dayton is to provide the services necessary to ensure that the student-athletes, while competing athletically, will progress academically towards a bachelors degree from the University of Dayton. Academic Services for Student-Athletes promotes a total person concept to the student-athletes, a concept that stresses the student-athletes' abilities to excel in athletic competition, attain academic achievement and develop positive character traits that will be of sustaining value to the individual and society.

Athletic accomplishments do not come at the expense of academic performance at UD. In 2003, the University of Dayton was ranked No. 8 nationally in NCAA graduation rates of the over 300 NCAA Division I institutions. This is a tremendous accomplishment and exhibits the continuing importance placed upon academic success at Dayton.

As success on the field has improved, UD student-athletes have also performed in the classroom. The Flyers' combined cumulative grade point average has steadily risen to 3.14, the best in school history. UD has had 25 Academic All-Americans in the last five years. Only Nebraska, Rensselaer Poly and Rice had more. In the most recent release, Dayton's 174 student-athletes on the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll were the third-most in the conference, even though the Flyers participate in fewer A-10 sports than all but one school. UD had the most players on the PFL Academic Honor Roll for the fourth straight year in 2004.



### Goals of the University of Dayton Student-Athlete Academic Services:

- To offer assistance with tutorial and study skills.
- To provide a facility with an atmosphere conducive to studying.
- To enhance student-athletes' knowledge through probing/questioning of thoughts, ideas and reactions.
- To stimulate the student-athletes' thought process with different ideas other than their own.
- To develop and encourage critical thinking.
- To monitor the study patterns of the student-athlete.
- To develop study strategies to achieve academic success at the University of Dayton.
- To enhance the academic motivation of the student-athletes.
- To help develop academic responsibility in each student-athlete.
- To develop appropriate collaborative learning experiences for student-athletes that facilitate their mutual support.







## Sports Medicine Staff

At the University of Dayton, the health and well being of our student-athletes is a primary concern. We strive to prevent injuries through pre-participation physical examinations, well-designed conditioning programs, warm-ups, proper practice planning, and appropriate equipment selection. When an athletic injury occurs, our goal is to provide the best medical care possible from the initial first-aid to the follow-up care and rehabilitation.

### FACILITIES

There are two Athletic Training Rooms in operation at the University of Dayton. The Arena Training Room is located in the Donohoe Basketball Center and utilized by Arena Complex teams for practices and games. The Frericks Center training room is open year round and is utilized for treatment and rehabilitation to all sports in the mornings and serves those sports that operate out of the Frericks Center in the afternoon.

### STAFF

The University of Dayton Sports Medicine Staff consists of a team of Family Practice Physicians and Orthopedic Consultants and four full-time and two graduate assistant certified and licensed Athletic Trainers, any of whom may be consulted regarding injuries or illnesses. In particular instances the Head Team Physician may refer athletes to other physicians or specialists. However, the Head Team Physician supervises the status of all athletes referred to other physicians or specialists and has the final authority with regard to all medical disqualifications, treatment, and return to play. Referrals to specialists will be made through the Team Physicians or Athletic Trainers only.

Trained personnel are present at all athletic contests and, where possible, at all practices to insure prompt medical attention. Priority for coverage is given to those sports where the risk of injury is greatest. The Sports Medicine Staff works closely with the coaching staff to keep them informed regarding the medical status of the athletes.



## Sean Convery, M.D.



### Head Team Physician

Dr. Sean Convery is in his fourth year heading up Dayton's medical staff. Convery's primary full-time position is serving as the medical director of The Sports Medicine Center at Miami Valley Hospital in Dayton. In addition, he is a faculty member in the Family Practice Residency Program at Miami Valley Hospital; associate clinical professor in the Department of Family Practice at Wright State University School of Medicine; school physician for the Kettering City School District; and team physician at Kettering Fairmont High School.

Convery is past president of the Miami Valley Academy of Family Practice and serves as Montgomery County Medical Association delegate to the Ohio State Medical Association. He is a member of the American College of Sports Medicine and a charter member of the American Medical Society for Sports Medicine. Convery is active within the Dayton community, having been involved as a volunteer physician for the Nike Tour, Jingle Bell Run for Arthritis, Dayton River Corridor Classic and Special Olympics.

A 1977 summa cum laude graduate of the University of Steubenville in Steubenville, Ohio, Convery holds a Bachelor of Arts in chemistry. He is a 1981 graduate of the Wright State University School of Medicine. He is a board certified family practice physician with additional certification in sports medicine. A Philadelphia native, Convery currently resides in Centerville.

## Tim Quinn, M.D.



### Orthopedic Consultant

Former Flyer football standout Dr. Tim Quinn serves his alma mater as the orthopedic consultant for UD Athletics. A 1973 graduate, Quinn has been associated with the Flyers in this capacity since 1988. He was a two-time First Team Academic All-America, and was chosen a National Football Foundation/College Football Hall of Fame Scholar-Athlete in 1972. A versatile player, he was a starter at linebacker and on the defensive line in his career. He is also a two-time winner of UD's John L. Macbeth Memorial Scholar-Athlete Award.

Quinn received his medical degree from Ohio State in 1976, and then received a fellowship to study at the International College of Surgeons in London, England. He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons, and a member of the Orthopedic Society for Sports Medicine and Arthroscopy Association of North America.

Quinn's father Joe played and coached football at UD, and is a member of UD's Athletic Hall of Fame. The Quinn family -- Tim, his father Joe, his brother Dan and his uncle Fran -- combined for 14 football letters. Dr. Quinn is in his 26th year of orthopedic surgery in Dayton.

## What is a prospective student-athlete/“prospect”?

A prospect is any student who has started classes for the ninth (9<sup>th</sup>) grade, any student who receives financial assistance or other benefits from UD and/or its athletics representative that are not normally provided to prospective students generally.

You become a “recruited prospective student-athlete” at a particular college if any coach or representative of the college’s athletics interests (booster or representative) approaches you (or any member of your family) about enrolling and participating in athletics at that college. Activities by coaches or boosters that cause you to become a recruited prospective student-athlete are:

- Providing you with an official visit\*
- Placing more than one telephone call to you or any other member of your family
- Visiting you or any other member of your family anywhere other than the college campus

*\* You may take a maximum of five “official visits” with no more than one to any single institution*

## NCAA Compliance

### The NCAA and You

The University of Dayton is committed to the principle of institutional control in operating its athletics program in a manner that is consistent with the letter and spirit of NCAA, conference and university rules and regulations. The University’s commitment is to maintain control of its athletics programs through cooperation between responsible administrators, coaches, faculty, all institutional staff members, student-athletes and representatives of the University’s athletics interests.

### Who are UD Athletics Representatives/Boosters\*?

- Any current and former member of any UD Athletics Division fan support group
- Any contributor to UD Athletics or booster group members
- Season ticket holders
- Anyone who has helped arrange employment or employed a current or prospective student-athlete
- Anyone who has been involved, in any way, in the promotion of Flyer Athletics

*\*Please note: Once you become an athletics representative, you retain that identity indefinitely.*

### What are Extra Benefits?

An extra benefit is any special arrangement by a UD staff member or an athletics representative to provide a prospective or enrolled student-athlete or his/her family with a benefit not specifically authorized by NCAA regulations. Impermissible extra benefits would include, but are not limited to:

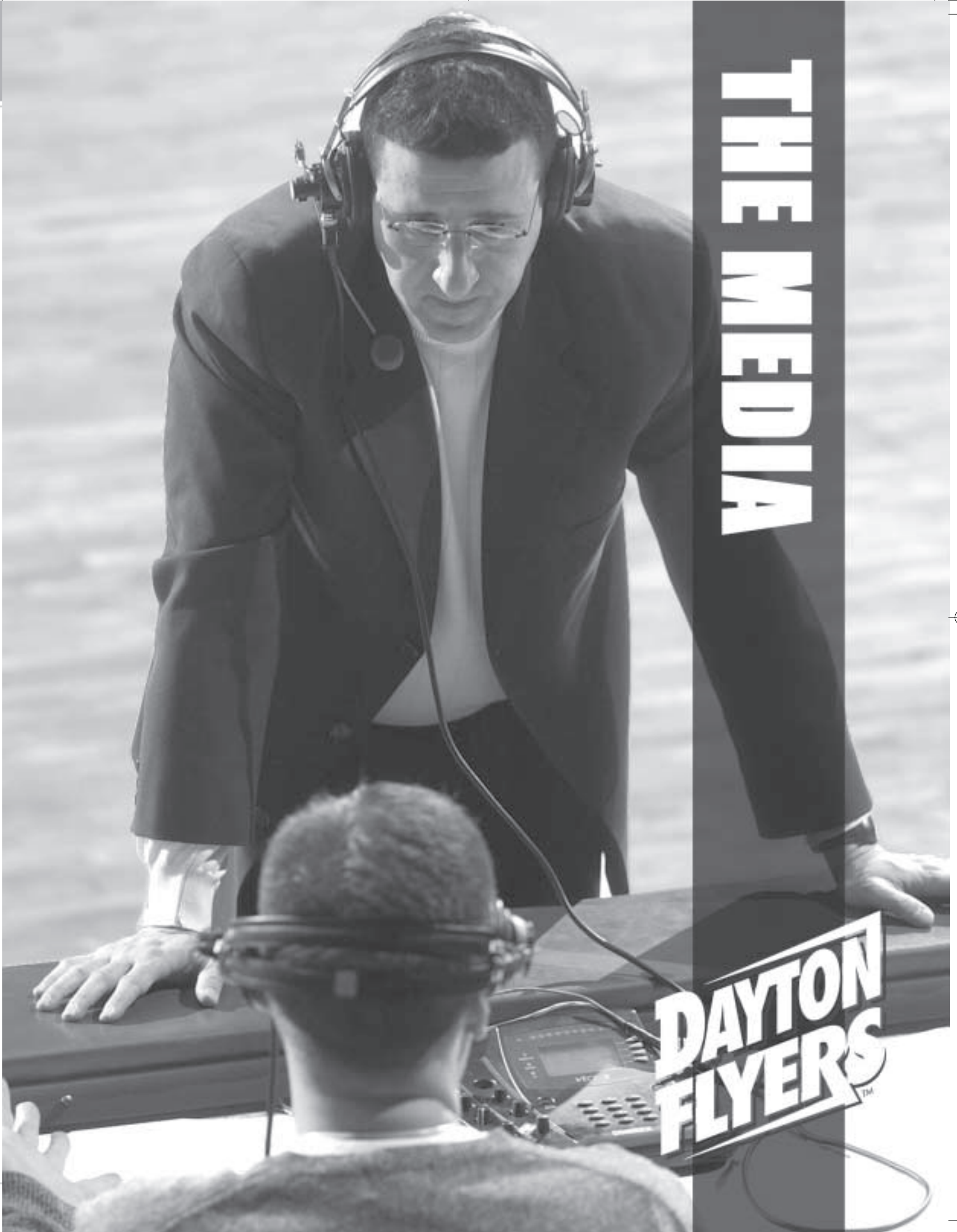
- Cash or loans of any amount
- Co-signing or arranging a loan
- Gifts or discounted/free services (e.g., airline tickets, merchandise, etc.)
- Rent-free or reduced-cost housing
- Employment of a student-athlete at a rate higher than wages paid for similar work
- Payment to a student-athlete for work not performed

## To The Media

### Media Credentials

Credentials are issued to accredited members of the media by Doug Hauschild in the Athletics Communication Office (937-229-4390) at least 24 hours prior to each game. Media passes will be picked up at the media entrance gate, next to the loading dock in the back of the UD Arena.

### Photo Credentials

Photo passes for Flyer games will be issued by the Athletics Communication Office to accredited members of the media only. All requests must be made at least 24 hours prior to each home game. Still photographers are restricted to the right side of the basket at either end of the floor (per NCAA Tournament guidelines) unless prior arrangements are made with Doug Hauschild in the Athletics Communication Office (937-229-4390). Also, no flash photography is permitted unless approved in advance.

### Press Room Services

The basketball press room is located beneath the administrative offices at the UD Arena. It can be reached via the ramp that connects the outside to courtside. Team information, game programs, and starting line-ups with game officials will be available before the game. Halftime stats will be delivered to press row at intermission and a full NCAA box with play-by-play will be furnished to members of the working press. Coaches' quotes and possibly featured player quotes (depending on the game) will also be made available. This information will be available about 30 minutes following each home game at [www.DaytonFlyers.com](http://www.DaytonFlyers.com).

### Post Game Filing

Fax service is available at the Arena. The press room will be equipped with three telephones available on a first-come, first-served basis. Persons requiring telephones at courtside should order phones through Doug Hauschild in the Athletics Communication Office (937-229-4390). Those ordering phone service directly through Ameritech cannot be guaranteed courtside placement. **Accessible wireless internet is available at courtside and in the media work room.**

### Press Row

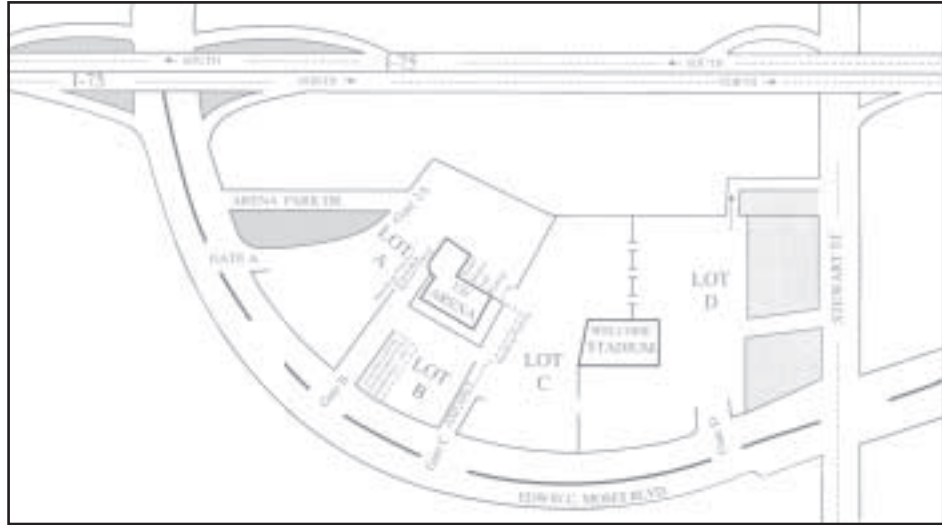
